

SEAGLASS ACCESSIBILITY POLICIES

The Seaglass Carousel accommodates many of those with special needs or a disability. We strive to accommodate all Guests who wish to enjoy the ride. However, for your safety, riding may be prohibited in any case where conditions are inappropriate, dangerous, or unable to meet the rules and regulations of the ride.

Ride Description: Non-traditional carousel that seats you in either static or moving fish, on a turntable that provides 360 degree rotations while fish with movement rotate on separate independent 360 degree turntables moving up and down with a rotational swivel.

ALL RIDERS MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING RIDE REQUIREMENTS

Riders must be at least 42" tall to ride unaccompanied. A person under 42" tall must sit in the lap of an accompanying adult capable of ensuring the person's compliance with all safety rules. The child must be secured under the seatbelt.

Riders need to be able to assume a seated upright posture on the moving fish and must have the ability to sit upright independently during the dynamic conditions of the ride. Riders must have control of upper torso, head and neck.

Riders must wear a seatbelt and meet all ride rules and regulations.

Seaglass offers two static fish that are ADA wheelchair accessible. Riders in a wheelchair may remain in their wheelchair for the duration of the ride. Wheelchair riders may be directed to board through the exit of the ride or use a secondary entrance as instructed by the Ride Attendant. Please note some motorized wheelchairs or ECV's may not fit in wheelchair accessible fish.

Riders with mobility restrictions or special needs may be excused from waiting in line. His/her companion may wait in line and have the rider join when it is their turn to ride. All riders with disabilities will be provided a reasonable amount of time to enter and exit.

Those riders wishing to ride a moving fish may need companion assistance transferring to the ride vehicle. Seaglass Ride Attendants are not permitted to assist in physically transferring a rider to or from a seat.

Service animals, comfort animals, emotional support animals or therapy animals are not permitted on Seaglass due to the theatrical light and sound elements and unpredictable movement of fish.
